To Augustus Bishop of the first part, William Blaw of the second part and Thomas Porter of
Porter. the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses that
in witness the said Augustus Bishop stands jointly indebted to the said Thomas Porter
in the sum of Forty one dollars and twenty five cents due by promissory note bearing date
with these presents and on demand the 12th day of October 1832 and the said Augustus
Bishop being desired to come to the said Thomas Porter the amount of the aforesaid
note do hereby agreed for that purpose to convey and also in consideration of one dollar
containing property to the said William Blaw to wit One feather bed and furniture and
down one table, Eleven Head of Hogs all my Crop of Corn and Cotton for the present year
with this promise that it be enough to satisfy William Newton and James
Pond for part of said Crop land &c in First nevertheless that if the said Augustus
Bishop should fail to discharge the said note of forty one dollars and twenty five
cents on or before the 12th of October 1832 then it shall be the duty of the said William
Blaw at the request of the said Thomas Porter to set up and sell to the highest bidder
having previously given legal notice of the same the aforesaid property hereinafter named for
Cash &c money and the proceeds of said sale to be applied in the following manner
by the said Blaw first pay and discharge all cost attending the execution of this Deed
