But if the said Augustin Bishop should on or before said date become due pay and discharge the same costs & charges this indenture and every thing herein contained to be void and of none effect. Williams This Indenture made and entered into this 16th day of July 1832 Between Samuel Williams of the first part James Mayet of the second part and Abraham Reddick of the third part Witnesses that whereas the said Samuel Williams is justly indebted to the said Abraham Reddick in the sum of nine hundred and seventy two dollars and forty seven cents as will more fully appear by his bond executed to the said Abraham Reddick and bearing date the day and year aforesaid, which said sum with the interest thereon accruing the said James Mayet is willing and desirous to become surety therefore in satisfaction of the bond and for the further consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Williams the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Samuel Williams has granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents does grant bargain sell alien and convey to the said James Mayet his heirs & assigns all that tract and parcel of land situate in the said Samuel Williams' name containing by estimation two hundred acres and bounded by the lands of Edward Eldon Jonathan Britz and William Reddick with all the tenements and appurtenances therunto belonging, also three negroes named Tom, Cato and Philled two hundred cattle, twenty hogs all his household and kitchen furniture of every sort and kind and every part and parcel thereof, and his crop of Corn fodder, peas, and cotton and every part thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements and appurtenances therunto belonging the said negroes, horses, cattle, hogs, household & kitchen furniture, crop of Corn fodder, peas and cotton with every part and parcel thereof to him the said James Mayet his heirs and assigns forever. Upon this special trust and condition nevertheless that the said James Mayet shall suffer the said Samuel Williams to remove in quiet and peaceable possession of the said land, negroes, cattle, hogs, furniture, crop of Corn &c and take the profits thereof to his own use until otherwise requested by the said Abraham Reddick and upon the request of the said Abraham Reddick the said James Mayet after giving fifteen days notice
