 paid by the said Henry Moore at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these
 presents doth bargain sell and convey unto the said Henry Moore his heirs
 assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the said
 County and State containing by old Survey four hundred and Eighteen acres
 more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at the Mill Pond bridge running
 southwesterly to the Land of Abraham Thomas thence to the Land of J. T. Sumner
 thence to the lands of Joseph C. Gland thence to the beginning where
 and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular appurtenances there
 unto belonging unto the said Henry Moore his heirs and assigns forever and the said
