This Indenture made this 10th day of May One Thousand Eight hundred and thirty two Between John Womack of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Henry Moore of the said County and State of the other part witnesseth that the said John Womack in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars to him in hand paid by the said Henry Moore at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain sell and convey unto the said Henry Moore his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the said County and State containing by old Survey four hundred and Eighteen acres more or less and bounded as follows Beginning at the New Pond bridge running South Course to the land of Abraham A Thomas thence to the land of Jas^l Thomas thence to the land of Joseph T. Clark thence to the beginning of the said land and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all and singular appurtenances thereto unto belonging unto the said Henry Moore his heirs and assigns forever and the said John Womack doth warrant and for ever defend the right and title of the above tract of land unto the said Henry Moore his heirs and assigns forever.
