William Harrison shall suffer the said Samuel Williams to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said Slave and their increase interringues by the Abraham Reddick to make sale thereof whereupon he the said William Harrison after giving ten days previous notice thereof shall sell the publick saleation for Cash the said Slave with their increase or so many slaves as may be necessary for the purpose and after paying all expenses attending the premises and sale, shall pay to the said Abraham Reddick the sum of four hundred dollars with all the interest which may have accrued and the balance thereof shall pay over to the said Samuel Williams his heirs but should the said sum of four hundred dollars with the interest therin be at any time fully paid to Abraham Reddick by the said Samuel Williams his heirs Ex 3 &c then the above indenture to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue. Blow Indenture made this 21st day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred
and thirty two Between William T. Blow of the first part Augurton Pop. 1000 of the sum
of one thousand and three hundred and twenty five dollars and twenty five cents due to James Jackson
and Lewis Morrell of the third part all of the County of Southampton State of New
York whereas the said William T. Blow is greatly indebted to the said Lewis Morrell by his
Excess debts even date with these presents in the sum of four hundred and one dollars fifty cents also
to L. Morrell whereas the said Lewis Morrell has become Security for the said William T. Blow
Sect 17/1834 for the sum of Four hundred and forty six dollars fifty nine cents due to James Jackson
payable on the 25th day of December next which said two debts with the legal interest
thereon according the said William T. Blow is willing and desires to liquidate now this
Indenture wherein it is stipt for and in consideration of the premises and also for the
further Consideration of one dollar of lawful money of New York to the said William Blow
we have paid by the said Lewis at and before the sealing and delivery of this
present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Blow both
given granted bargained sold aliented enfeoffed released and confirmed and by these
presents doth give grant bargains sell alien enfeoff release and confirm to the said
Augurton Pop. his heirs and assigns for ever the following two tracts or parcels of land
and Slaves viz One tract or parcel of land situated lying in and being in the aforesaid
of Southampton and Parish of Saint Luke, containing by late Survey one hundred and
thirty six and four fourth acres to be the same more or less at being the tract of land
whereon the said William T. Blow now resides and bounded by the lands of James
Blow, Thomas Kelley, James Stephen, Peter Clark and others also one other tract
