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William Harrison shall suffer the said Samuel Williams to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said Slaves and their increase until so quieted by the Abraham Reddick to make sale thereof whereupon he the said William Harrison after giving ten days previous notice thereof shall direct public Auction for Cash the said Slaves with their increase or so many of them as may be necessary for the purpose and after paying all expenses attending the premises and sale, shall pay to the said Abraham Reddick the said sum of four hundred dollars with all the interest which may have thereon accrued and the balance thereof shall pay over to the said Samuel Williams his heirs &c but should the said sum of four hundred dollars with the interest thereon at any time fully paid to Abraham Reddick by the said Samuel Williams his heirs &c then the above indenture to be void other wise to remain in full force and virtue. Blow now resides and bounded by the lands of James Blow Thomas Kelley, Amos Stephens, Arthur Mink and others also one other tract
