 David Chitty of the first part Thomas Chitty and Ursula Chitty of the last part (a child of the
 parties of the County of Southampton this Indenture Witnesseth that whereas the said David
 Chitty stands jointly indebted to the said Ursula Chitty in the sum of forty seven dollars &
 ten Cents appearing by Bond of even date herewith as well as this indenture now then
 in the hands of the said David Chitty being reading and desiring to secure the payment of the said
 debt and interest which shall accrue thereon to him the said Ursula Chitty from and
 in consideration of the same and for the further sum of one dollar to him the said
 David Chitty in hand paid by the above named at and before the writing and delivery
 of this present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and from which he is discharged
 Thomas Chitty his heirs and assigns are forever released exonerated and discharged and do hereby bargain and sell that is to say he the said David Chitty have bought
 and sold and do by these presents evidence the bargaining and selling of the following
 named property to him the said Thomas Chitty his heirs and assigns forever that to wit
 say two horses twenty four head of sheep four hundred and thirty six
 four tables six chests one trunk one safe two pots one set of iron one
 iron pot rack five earthen dishes fifteen earthen plates three pewter plates one pewter
 basin twelve pewter spoons seven wash basins one loom and harness
 wheels two pair of axes one cart and wheels six ploughs one dozen saws
