parties of the County of Southampton this Indenture witnesseth that whereas the said Brown
Chitty stands fully indebted to the said Ursula Chitty in the sum of forty nine dollars &
ten Cents appearing by Bond of even date herewith as well as there indenture now ther
to the Chitty the said Ursula Chitty being willing and desirous to sume the payment of the
Debt and interest which shall accrue thereon to her the said Ursula Chitty having
on the 5th day of June 1832 in consideration of the same and for the further sum of one dollar to her the said
Ursula Chitty in hand paid by the above named at and before the making and delivery
of these presents the receipt whereof hereby acknowledged and from which he the said
Thomas Chitty her heirs and assigns are forever released exonerated and discharged from
and do hereby bargain and sell that is to say to the said Ursula Chitty her heirs
