to Murdough  
Aug 5, 1838

This Indenture made and entered into this the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and thirty two between George W. Ricks and Owen Ricks of the County of Southampton of the first part and James Murdough of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said George W. Ricks for and in consideration of the sum of two thousand Eight hundred and Eighty four dollars and Eighty cents to him paid or seemed to be paid and by and with the Consent and approbation of the said Owen Ricks signified by his becoming a party to and signing these presents and the said Owen Ricks have given granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said James Murdough his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a post as near to a branch a corner between the land hereby intended to be conveyed and Owen Ricks and running N 81° E 24. 40 poles to a pine a continuation of the same lands thence S 63° E 66. poles to a pine standing where the S<sup>o</sup> pole to a pine thence S 25° E 57. 04 poles thence S 48° E 66. poles thence N 68° E 99. 53 poles thence S 28° W 55. 32 poles thence N 79° W 65. poles thence S 7. 11. 28. poles thence E 32° 8' 10. 80 poles thence N 17. 615. 72 poles thence N 69. I do have and to hold the said tract of land and promises to let its appurtenances unto him the said James Murdough his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and best of them the said James Murdough his heirs and assigns forever and the said George W. Ricks and Owen Ricks forthwith do their Executor and adm'ns Entit'g to hereby Consent and agree to and with the said James Murdough his heirs and assigns that they will remain and forever defend the right and title to the aforesaid tract or parcel of land which its appurtenances inholding the said James Murdough his heirs and assigns against the right, title, claim or demand of themselves the said George W. Ricks and Owen Ricks their heirs and assigns and of all and every person or persons whatsoever. In Testimony whereof the said George W.
