This Indenture made this 10th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight
hundred and thirty two Between Holliday Wootton debtor of the first part and James B. Holliday
Trustee of the second part and William Hollions Creditor of the third part Whereas the
Holliday Wootton justly indebted unto the said Wilson Hollions in the sum of
three hundred and twenty five Dollars of Virginia money due by unto bearing date the 10th day
of March 1831 which debt with the legal interest thereon the said Holliday Wootton is
willing and desirous to sume & pay this Indenture witnesseth that for and consideration
of the promises and also of the further consideration of the sum of one dollar so
paid unto the said Holliday Wootton by the said James B. Hollions at and before
the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
be the said Holliday Wootton hath given grants and bargained almost released
and conveyed to the said James B. Hollions his heirs and assigns forever all of
my land which I held from the death of my father Thomas Wootton Esq^r Containing
80 acres more or less I have and to hold the aforesaid land hereby conveyed unto
the said James B. Hollions his heirs and assigns forever to the only purpose and
behalf of the said James B. Hollions his heirs Executing and administering
forever and the said Holliday Wootton for himself his heirs Executors and Administrators
Covenant promises and agrees to and with the said James B. Hollions his heirs and assigns
that is to say that the said Holliday Wootton his heirs &c the aforesaid land hereby conveyed
unto the said James B. Hollions his heirs and assigns against all persons whatsoever and their
and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon trust nevertheless that the
said James B. Hollions his heirs and assigns shall permit the said Holliday Wootton to
remain in quiet possession of the aforesaid land hereby conveyed and take the profits
thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment of the three hundred and
twenty five Dollars either in the whole or in part and so soon after such fault be
made, upon trust that the said James B. Hollions shall advertise and sell the said
land hereby conveyed to the highest bidder at public auction and the money
arising from or out of such sale shall after paying all charges and other expenses
of recovering the same pay to Holliday Wootton the remainder of any part of the sum
mentioned sum to be paid off before any default be made then the indenture to
take effect or otherwise remain in full force and virtue till witness whereof the
said parties to these presents doth set their hand and seals this 10th day of March ad
before dated,
