This Indenture made and entered into this 19th day of June in the year of our Lord
one thousand Eight hundred and thirty two Between Albert G. Mabry of the one part and
John Shephard Jr. of the other part both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
Witnessed that whereas the said Albert G. Mabry has been by his brother Robert G.
Mabry appointed his agent to sell a certain tract of Land in the County of Southampton
as appears by a Power of Attorney for that purpose which is hereto annexed and the said
Albert G. Mabry by virtue of the aforesaid Authority having sold a certain tract of land
which the said Power of Attorney authorizes him the said Albert to sell with a power
conveying the same in fee simple to the purchaser thereof at or the bed and further more
agrees that the said Albert G. Mabry for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid
will for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt
whereof before the ensuance and delivery of these presents he doth hereby acknowledge that
by the aforesaid Authority vested in him granted bargained and sold and doth hereby grant
grant bargain and sell unto said John Shephard Jr. his heirs and assigns forever a certain
tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the Western part of the County of Southampton Con-
taining by estimation, Ten acres and forty acres be the same more or less adjoining the land
of David Lattys Estate the heirs of James first King and James Lattys heirs for a sum
particulars by bond and report made from Richard H. Hyde and Corp to Robert Mabry Clerk
in the Clerks Office of Southampton County in the year 1832 it being the same land which
descended to the said Robert Mabry by the Will of his uncle Robert Mabry deceased and
held the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said John
Shephard Jr. am his heir forever and the said Albert G. Mabry covenant and agree to
and with the said John Shephard to warrant such right and title thereto as is vested
in him by the aforesaid Power of attorney against the claim or claims of all persons who
