

This Indenture made this 16 day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five between of the one P. Side of the County of Southampton of the first part, Mark Harris and John H. Mason, Oris & Brown, William B. Goodhue, Spratley, Williams the legal representatives, James Willard deceased William Parker, George & W. A. Newsons and Mark P. Side of the second part and William C. Parker as Trustee for the other parties hereto for the purposes hereinafter mentioned of the third part. Whereas the said Alexander P. Side is comprehended in his own covenants and is herein the parties hereto of the second part are responsible for him as sureties for debts considerable sums of money and as he is likewise indebted to the said Mark P. Side as Guardian that as to say the said Mark Harris is bound as his duty was bound to Joseph Claude for the sum of £500 to J. Drew for the sum of £500 to Lewis Harris for the sum of £500 and to William W. Whitcomb and on a forbearance bond payable to Mills & Lawrence for the sum of £500 and also on a forbearance bond payable to Samuel Brown for the sum of £500 and the said John H. Mason, Oris & Brown are sureties for the said Alexander P. Side's faithful administration on the estate of Edward Reed deceased and the said William B. Goodhue is surety for the said Alexander P. Side in a bond executed to Joseph H. C. for the sum of \$1000 and the said Spratley, Williams is surety to the said Alexander P. Side in a bond to George & W. A. Newsons and the said James Willard in his lifetime was surety for the said Alexander P. Side in a bond to William Briggs for the sum of £500 and the said William Parker and George & W. A. Newsons as sureties for the said Alexander P. Side in a bond to Mills & Lawrence for the sum of \$1000 and the said Alexander P. Side is indebted to the said Mark P. Side as Guardian for the sum of £500 and also by two bonds for the amount of £500 executed by the said Alexander P. Side to the said Mark P. Side and whereas the said Alexander P. Side seems it right and proper that he should endeavor to secure these said parties if possible against any wrongful injury or inconvenience in consequence of their said covenants and liabilities. Now this indenture witnesseth that the said Alexander P. Side for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of five dollars to him in hand paid by the said William C. Parker such bargain, sold, conveyed and delivered and by these presents doth bargain, sell, convey and deliver unto the said William C. Parker and his assigns forever the following property to wit: Slave, Ben, Isaac, Washington, Parkman, Tom Pelcher, little Tom, Henry, Jendars, Bob, Tom, a Copin, and his tools, father Henry and Child, Maria and her four children, Eliza, Rachel and her four children Pleasant and Child, Henry, ~~the~~ and the future increase of the said female slaves all his growing crops of corn, fodder and cotton all his farming utensils his tools and barrels household and kitchen furniture cotton gin Waggons and the grower and belonging to the Waggons together with all his other stock whatsoever, consisting of mules, horses, hogs cattle and sheep and one pig and harness to have and to hold the ^{same} property to him and his assigns forever and his four children and this Indenture is upon this express condition that of the said Alexander P. Side his heirs Executors or administrators shall well and lawfully pay and satisfy the said sum of money for which the said parties hereto of the second part are bound as his sureties and shall well and truly relieve his charges and exonerate the said parties such and every of them from all loss injury and future liability therefor and shall well and lawfully pay and satisfy the said Mark P. Side all sums of money due to him as Guardian aforesaid as well as the amount of the two bonds aforesaid
