This Indenture made and entered into this the 17 day of July 1832 Between Oris
A. Brown of the first part & William C. Parker of the second part and Jesse Sanford of the third
part and all of the County of Southampton. Witnesseth that whereas the said Oris A. Brown
stands jointly indebted unto the said Jesse Sanford with the just sum of fifteen hundred dol-
lars for certain conveyance unto the said Jesse Sanford and payable on demand And whereas the said
Oris A. Brown is desirous to secure and have agreed to secure the payment of the said
debt with the interest that may thereon lawfully accrue with all charges attending the
same, or incurred by reason of the premises, by conveying the property herein after mentioned
unto the said William C. Parker and to be sold for that purpose: it was therefore
this Indenture further Witnesseth that the said Oris A. Brown in consideration
of the premises and of the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him by the
said W. C. Parker in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that
bargained and sold conveyed and made over and do by these presents bargain and sell
confirm and make over unto him the said William C. Parker his heirs executors and
assigns the following property to wit: The tract of land whereon the said Oris A.
Brown now resides containing five hundred acres more or less being the same land
whereby the said Brown purchased of Thomas R. Gray by deed admitted to Record
in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County on the 24 day of March 1830 for the Com-
mission of the said land reference may be had to the said deed also the following slaves
to wit: Peter, Jesse, Shamus, and Fidelity To have and to hold the said estate
and property above mentioned unto him the said William C. Parker his heirs executors
administrators and assigns in full and upon condition nevertheless that if the said
Oris A. Brown shall fail to pay the whole of the aforesaid debt with the legal interest
thereon to the said Jesse Sanford his executors administrators or assigns within the term of
