

It shall be lawful for the said Testator P. Edwards or in case of his death for his legal personal representatives or representatives, being requested so to do by the said John Lantford his Executor administrator or agents to make sale of the estate and property aforesaid or any part thereof to the highest bidder in cash, having first advertised the time and place and terms of sale for at least thirty days at the Commissioners of Southampton County and at such other public places as the said Trustee may think necessary and of the proceeds of such sale in the first place to discharge all legal and usual costs and expenses attending the sale and the second place to pay and satisfy the debt and interest hereinfirst recited to be due to the said John Lantford so much as shall be in arrear at the time and in the third place the surplus if any, pay to the said Orvis & Brown his legal representatives or Order and the said Orvis & Brown does hereby Covenant with the said Testator P. Edwards that he is possessed of an absolute estate in fee simple in all the property aforesaid that he will never disannul the title hereby conveyed against all persons whatever. I know all men by these presents that I Samuel Drury of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the material love and affection which I bear to my brother John Drury of the said County and State of Virginia have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John Drury so many feet of land from the land known as the lands of Mrs. Hobbs' Estate and mine from the Creek to the road laying contained at all times a free and convenient passage from the road to the Creek which road appears now plain to say the intention of this gift is intended to prevent at any future time taking away the benefit of the said Creek from the said John Drury & his heirs & executors. This gift is not intended to be of any force or effect only so long as the said John Drury lives which he now resides in the purpose of him of a sum of his offspring. I do hereby warrant and defend the right and title of said gift unto the said John Drury and his offspring. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
