Letter of Credit of County of Southampton and State of Virginia deceased and to give sufficient  
acquittances therefor and to adjust Settlement and Compromise all debts demands and claims existing  
against said Estate and to institute prospective for the recovery thereof and the same to pass  
to final judgment and execution and to recover from any person having charge of said  
estate all monies due to me as aforesaid and all other or any of the goods or property belonging  
to said estate and to execute all such Bonds releases and Contracts of indenture in  
the premises that he may see fit and to take and institute all such proceedings and to do  
and perform all such acts matter and things as may be proper under and by virtue  
of the Laws of said State of Virginia in the Settlement of said estate with the right  
and power of Substitute and hereby certifying all that my said Attorney or his Substitutes  
may or shall lawfully do in the premises as is written upon his hands and seal at  
Pitchfield aforesaid the 18<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1831.

To Bristor I now affirm by these presents that we H. B. Bristor Jas. Sumner and  
are held and firmly bound unto John Troy & Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia  
Governor the first and full sum of five thousand Dollars to be paid to the said Governor and his Successors  
receipt for the payment whereof will and truly to be made we bind ourselves and each of us  
his Executives and Administrators jointly and severally jointly by these present sealed with  
our Seals and dated this 20<sup>th</sup> day of August 1832.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above named Thomas  
Bristor has been duly appointed by the Court of Southampton County to serve as Constable  
within the said County until June next 1833 in the room of James Bell late Sheriff the said  
Thomas Bristor shall uses and truly discharge the duties of the Office of Constable in the said  
County during his continuance therein then the above obligation to be void or else to remain in full force  
Signed sealed and acknowledged  
in Open Court.
