This Indenture made this twenty sixth day of June in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and thirty two Between Robert Bellamy Clerk of the County of Southampton  
of Virginia of the first part and Madam Vick of the aforesaid County and State of the second part  
and Sabah Ellsworth of the Said County and State of the third part witnesseth the said  
Bellamy Clerk for the sum of One Thousand and paid to me by the said Sabah Ellsworth  
the receipt whereof as hereby acknowledged do long now see deliver and confirm and by these  
presents do bargain and deliver unto Madam Vick one certain tract or parcel of land  
lying and being Situate in the aforesaid County of Southampton and State of Virginia  
Beginning and bounded by Margaret Clarkes house Bicks and Benjamin Bunn's land  
containing by estimation Seventy six acres to the same more or less with all houses and  
very appurtenance thereto belonging growing and every other thing unto appertaining also one  
chesnut Sorel Mare Eight head of cattle Twenty head of Hogs Six head of sheep Two  
further beds and furniture also one more partitioned and furnished one Walnut tree  
One Maple deck two sets Tiling Chamfranes one pine chest one gun one pair of ffe.  
wms ten Dishes also all the kitchen furniture and plantation utensils of all describing  
to Seem a debt due to the above mentioned Robert Bellamy Clerk of Thre hundred and fifty  
dollars and twenty six cents due and owing him by date equal to these presently standing  
provided that the said Bellamy Clerk should on due time pay unto the said Madam Vick  
the above mentioned debt and interest thereon due to be had, or else to remain in the hands  
of the said Sabah Ellsworth to sell all the above mentioned property agreeable to her  
to pay the said debt and cost that may then or accrue and after such to reserve the  
amount that may originate of his Grandnephew of Sally Clark Orphan of Samuel Clark  
deceas and after all the debts and costs above mentioned is fully paid off and satisfied the  
remainder of such debts shall be paid over unto the said Bellamy Clerk or his heirs or
