This Indenture made and entered into this 20th day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty two Between Orris & Browne of the County of Southampton of the first part Benjamin Williamson of the said County of the second part and John J. Mason of the third part Whereas the said Orris & Browne is indebted to the said John J. Mason in the sum of three thousand one hundred and eighty five dollars and seventy five cents due by bond bearing date the sixth day of August 1832 payable on demand with interest from that date and he is unwilling and desirous effectually to secure the payment of the said sum of money with the interest which may accrue thereon A Notar Public Metropolis of the State of New York in witness whereof of the premises and of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Benjamin Williamson, the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge he the said Orris & Browne hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents hath bargained and sold unto the said Benjamin Williamson his executors and assigns all his right title and interest in the following negro slaves to wit Men Claiborne, John, Mary, Tom, Peter, Roger, Andrew, Ephraim, boys Miles, Jim, Little Claiborne, George, Charles, Ben, Amos, and Sam, Women, Fanny, Pat, Betty, Phillis, and Mary girls Eliza, Faticia or Richa, Aggy, Catharine, Phoebe, Amy, Edy & an infant Child of the woman Phillis named Selvia with all their future increase which said negro slaves are now held at the dawn of Mr. Susan Phipps wife of John Phipps of Southampton County of the slaves of her former husband James Phipps and to which negro slaves, Subject to the said Widow's life estate as aforesaid the said Browne is entitled as husband of Susan J. his wife only child and heir at law of the said James Phipps dec^d To have and to hold the said negro slaves with their future increase Subject to the said Widow's life estate and in present possession at the termination of the said Widow's life to him and his executors and assigns. Upon Trust nevertheless that of the said sum of money shall be comprised with the interest thereon or any part thereof and the said Trustee shall be by the said Mason required he the said Benjamin Williamson shall after advertising at the first house of the said County for thirty days the time and place of sale proceed to sell the interest in the said negro slaves and in case or the slaves themselves if the life estate aforesaid be expired at public auction for cash and out of the proceeds pay first the expenses of this trust then the debt and interest remaining unpaid to the said Mason his executors or assigns and the balance of any to the said Browne his executors and assigns and the said Williamson that he shall have the said interest in possession with possession of the negro slaves herein conveyed in possession at the death of the said Widow Subject to the condition of this trust free from the claims of all persons whatsoever and the said Williamson covenants with the said Browne and Mason singly and jointly that he will well and faithfully execute the Trust confided to him and on the payment of the debt interest and expenses release to the said Browne or his assigns the property herein conveyed On Testimony whereof the said parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year aforesaid
