This Indenture made and concluded into this 21st day of August in the year one thousand Eight hundred and thirty two between Orvis & Brown of the County of Southampton of the first part there
William of the said County of the second part and John G. Mason of the third part Whereas
the said Orvis & Brown is indebted to the said John G. Mason in the sum of Three thousand
one hundred and Eighty five dollars and seventy three Cents due by him bearing date the
fifth day of August 1832. payable on demand with interest from that date and to be
settled and discharge effectually to secure the payment of the said sum of money with the
interest which may accumulate thereon A Novitius Indenture witnesseth that for and in consider-
ation of the premises and of the sum of one dollar to him or her by the said Benjamin
Williamson, the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge to the said Orvis & Brown
here granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the
said Benjamin Williamson his co-vening interest in the following negro slaves to wit
Ayo Men Glaborne, John Mary, Tom, Peter, Roger, Etadens, Ephraim, boys Miller, Jimi
Little Glaborne, George, Charles, Ben, Amos, and Sam, Women, Jemmy, Pat, Betty,
Phillis, and Mary, girls Eliza, Felicia & Bitha, aged, (latture), Phillis, any body &
and infant child of the woman Phillis name Silvia, with all this future increase
which said negro slaves are now held at the time of Mr. Susan Phillips wife
of John Shepherd of Southampton County of the slaves of his former husband James Lundy
and to which negro slave, Subject to the said Warden's life estate as aforesaid the said
Brown is entitled as husband of Susan J. his wife only child and his & her
of the said James Lundy dec'd to have and to hold the said negro slaves with their
future increase Subject to the said Warden's life estate and in trust prop of course the
termination of the said Warden's life to him and his Executor adms or execs. Represented
nowhereof that of the said sum of money shall be applied to the interest thereon or
any part thereof and the said trustee shall be by the said master required by the said
Benjamin Williamson shall after advertising at the first house of the said County for
thirty days the time and place of sale proceed to sell the interest in the said negro
slaves and increase of the slaves themselves of the life estate aforesaid be expid at
public auction for cash and out of the proceeds pay first the expenses of this trust then
the debt and interest remaining unpaid to the said Master his Exec or execs and the
balance of any to the said Brown his Exec or execs order and the said Brown commands
the said Williamson that he shall have the said interest in security with possession
of the negro slaves herein conveyed in possession at the death of the said Warden Subject to
the conditions of this trust free from the claims of all persons whatsoever and has Sir William
Brown to the said Brown and Mason singly and jointly that he will well
and faithfully execute the trust confided to him and on the payment of the debt, interest
and expenses relate to the said Brown or his execs the property herein Conveyed to Sir
William whom of the said parties have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals
