Witness all men by these presents that so hereas Benjamin Worrell of the County of Southampton did convey to and in trust by a deed in writing bearing date the 20th day of November 1826 and duly Recorded in the Clerk's Office for said County by which he said Worrell conveyed his right in and to a certain tract or parcel of Land supposed to contain about one hundred acres the boundaries of which will in time vary appear by the said deed of Trust also by the said deed conveyed his interest in right of his wife Nancy in and to the slaves allotted and assigned to Sally Woodard widow and child of John Woodard deceased of the County of Somerset in said decedents Slaves for the purpose of securing the payment of a Debt due and owing to Jacob Barnes of said County and whereas said Worrell transferred the payment of said Debt and the said Jacob Barnes by notice in writing requiring the immediate discharge of the said Debt by sale of the above named property whereupon I advertised the time and place of Sale agreeable to the Tenor of the said deed in Trust and have on this 23rd day of March 1832 sold at auction the said Land and interest in the Slaves described as aforesaid and the said Jacob Barnes then and there became the highest bidder for both Land and interest in and to the said Slaves for both of which he gave two hundred dollars and in consideration of which I do hereby convey all the right title interest and estate which was conveyed to me by the deed in Trust aforesaid in and to both the above named Land and interest in the said Slaves to him the said Jacob Barnes his heirs and assigns forever To have and to hold the said Land and interest in the said Slaves and every part and parcel thereof free from the claim of myself my heirs and assigns and I do by these presents warrant and defend against all who shall ever claim either Land or interest in the said Slaves under or by me or my Wife either of them or under or by my hand and affix my seal on this 23rd day of March 1832
