

South bargain and sold and conveyed and by these presents doth bargain and sell and convey unto the said J. R. Gray his heirs and assigns the following property to-wit: negro man Peter, Henry, Jesse, Remond, John and a woman Mary and Charlotte before First Overtold that if the said Orms & Brown shall will and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said James Mendenhall his heirs and assigns the full and entire sum required so to do by the said Mendenhall together with all interest and costs that may accrue thereon then this indenture to be void: But if the said Orms & Brown shall make default and fail to pay the said debt interest &c. then the said J. R. Gray shall proceed to sell the above named property or so much thereof as will pay what may become due on the above named debt for cash after giving fifteen days notice of the day and place of sale and out of the proceeds pay first all the expenses attending the execution of this trust next the debt interest and cost as aforesaid and the balance if any to the said Orms & Brown or his legal representatives. And the said Orms & Brown covenants that the said Gray shall have peaceable and quiet possession of the slaves above mentioned for the purpose of effecting a sale as aforesaid. And the said Gray covenants with the said Orms that he shall keep quiet possession of the said negroes until the day of sale. This Indenture made this 11th day of August in the year of our Lord (Christ) one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two Between William Griffin Master of the first part Benjamin Griffin Trustee of the second part and Allen Edwards and Burnell Branch Executors of the third part All of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said William Griffin is justly indebted to Joseph Rogers on the loan of five hundred dollars 71 cents due by Bond dated August 9th 1832 and also to Patrick Rouse the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars due by Bonds of the above mentioned debt and to which Bonds the said Allen Edwards and Burnell Branch are bound by virtue of the said William Griffin and are liable to pay for which the said William Griffin is willing to secure and in fact is the sole object of these presents. Now this Indenture witnesses that for and in consideration of the promises and also for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said William Griffin now paid by the said Benjamin Griffin as Trustee agrees and at or before the making and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Griffin that he doth grant bargain and sold and by these presents do give grant bargain and sell unto the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land
