I, Now all men by these presents that we George G. Gray and Silas Summerville held and firmly
bound unto John Gray Esq^r Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia on the first and full sum
of One Thousand Dollars to be paid to the Said Governor and his Successors or Trustees of the Common-
wealth To the payment whereof we and only we to be made executors and trustees on him our &
sons jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 17th day
of September 1832 The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the
Court of Southampton County has appointed the above bound, George G. G. Gray Commissioner
of the Revenue for said County for the Term of one year after the said George G. G. Gray
shall faithfully perform the duties of the said Office during the said term then the above obligation
to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.

Edward Edwards This Indenture made and executed this 28th day of August A.D. 1832 Between Richard
 Edwards of the one part and Evans Edwards and Catharine his wife of the other all of the County
 of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that whereas the said Evans Edwards and
 Catharine his wife do for and in consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars to them
 indebted pay by the said Richard Edwards the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Richard Edwards Evans Edwards his heirs and assigns forever
 One certain tract or parcel of land containing by Survey 113 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres lying and being in
 the lower part of Stony Creek Southampton County It also being one half of the tract
 of their father's tract of land which was sold at public auction for a division amongst
 him and Evans Edwards became the purchaser and is bounded as follows viz
 Beginning at a large pine in the Cedar Swamp or Ceder Swamp on the Madison's down &
 thus tract thence \$68 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 90° poles along the line between the said two and this said tree
 pine post in the Cornfield at corner between this tract and Evans Edwards half so Black
 the Madison's down thence \$11 $\frac{1}{2}$ E 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to find a line of pine post to the 113 $\frac{1}{2}$ down
 a line of marked trees the line between their tract and Evans Edwards half so Black
 from a corner in the State road between Evans Edwards and Richard Edwards in
 Penns Valley a line thence down the run of the stream to the bottom corner thereof 18 $\frac{1}{2}$
 to the Cedar Swamp thence up the Cedar Swamp the bottom corner thereof 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ poles to the
