This Indenture made and entered into this the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1832 between George Cuthbertson of the County of Southampton of the one part and James H. Beale of the same County of the other part. Whereas it is agreed that the said George Cuthbertson for and on consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars of good and lawful money of the Commonwealth of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said James H. Beale at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the said George Cuthbertson has by her granted bargained and sold and by these presents do give grant bargained and confirmed unto the said James H. Beale his heirs and assigns as certain tract or parcels of land lying and being in the County of Warwick The boundaries therof may be known by reference to a deed from Robert Cuthbertson and wife to the said George Cuthbertson bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 and duly recorded in the County Court of Southampton Containing by estimation three hundred thirty three and one half acres the same name of Community Numbered Cuts road tract and being the said George Cuthbertson's part of the lands due to him and his brother Robert Cuthbertson by the last will and testament of their deceased father Robert Cuthbertson Esquire and to hold the said tract or parcels of land with the appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said James H. Beale his heirs and assigns to the only proper uses and benefit of him the said James H. Beale his heirs and assigns forever And the said George Cuthbertson for himself his heirs Executors and administrators do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said James H. Beale his heirs and assigns that he the said George Cuthbertson and his heirs the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances unto him the said James H. Beale his heirs and assigns against him the said George Cuthbertson and his heirs and against all and every person or persons whomsoever shall and will by these presents for ever claim and defend In witness whereof the said George Cuthbertson hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above written.

Beale stands justly indebted to the said Edwards Bells in the sum of four hundred dollars by him or his to which the said Edwards Bells and Bailey Bryant as his security bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 and payables the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1833 And whereas the said Edwards Bells and Bailey Bryant are securities for the said James H. Beale on three several Bonds or Notes of three hundred dollars each dated the 17<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 made payable to George C.
