Witnesseth that the said Wicks of Gardner and Tabitha his wife for and in consideration of the Sum of One hundred and twenty nine Dollars twenty seven cents and 1/2 to them in hand paid by the said Nelson P. Gardner at or before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. They the said Wicks of Gardner and Tabitha his wife have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do sell and make of their dole grant bargain and sell unto the said Nelson P. Gardner his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton adjoining the lands of the said Wicks of Gardner Henry M. Clary's heirs and others marked and bounded as follows Beginning at a pine standing in M. Clary's line or corner of the lower line of the record of William Gardner and thence a straight line of marked trees to a gum in the poplar Island Branch the second corner of the line to a gum in the said Branch a corner thence a straight line of marked trees along the line to a stake in the aforesaid lower land thence along the lower line to the first station containing seventy two and a half acres be the same more or less the reversion and reversions hereafter and remainments of rents and other profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land unto the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Nelson P.
