This Indenture made and executed this 17th day of September & A.D. one thousand
Eight hundred and thirty two Between Randolph Fowler of the first part Edward Cumples
of the second part and James W. Munroe of the third part all of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia Witnesses that the said Edward Cumples is security for Randolph
Fowler and binds him for the payment of a bond executed to Mathew Munroe
for the sum of One hundred and sixteen dollars and some Cents and the said Randolph
Fowler being desirous to secure and indemnify the said Edward Cumples from the payment
thereof. The said Randolph Fowler have for and in consideration of the premises
aforesaid, but more especially for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him
in hand paid by the said James W. Munroe of which is acknowledged beyond
and sold and do by these presents bargain and sell forever unto the said James
W. Munroe his heirs Executors and assigns. One certain Negro man Rob. Nomin
the possession of the said Randolph Fowler. Upon the following terms to wit
If the said Randolph Fowler shall fail to pay the above debt when called for it
shall be right and just for the said James W. Munroe after giving sufficient notice
of the time and place of sale expose to sale the aforesaid Negro at public auction to the
highest bidder for cash lawful money of Virginia, and discharge the aforesaid
debt due from the said Fowler and Edward Cumples as security and all costs
pertaining this Indenture and such sale, and the surplus if any pay over to the said
Fowler his heirs Executors and assigns taking. And the said James W. Munroe is hereby
authorized to convey a full and legal title in fee simple to the purchaser or purchasers
and the Randolph Fowler is hereby authorized to hold and enjoy the use of the
aforesaid Negro until such sale is completed and the said Randolph Fowler
agrees to warrant and defend the same unto the said James W. Munroe his heirs
and assigns forever against all the claims or demands of him the said Randolph Fowler
and all and every person or persons. In Testimony whereof we the parties have
