This Indenture made this 16th day of July in the year of our Lord 1834 between James Boykin
of the first part, Jacob Banell his son of the second part and Lewis Worrell of the third part all of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia Whereas the said James Boykin is purely indebted to the said
Lewis Worrell by note bearing even date with this present in the sum of Three hundred and
fifty one thousand six hundred and twenty five dollars also whereas the said Lewis Worrell has become
bankrupt for said James Boykin to John Barret for the sum of Two hundred and Fifty one dollars twenty
cents On demand the said Jacob Banell two debts with the Legit interest thereon according
to the said James Boykin is willing and desirous to secure to him this Indenture whereof
that for and in Consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of one dollar
of lawful money of Virginia to the said James Boykin in hand paid by the said Jacob
Banell Trustee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is
hereby acknowledged by the said James Boykin hath given granted bargained sold alotted
inherited released and confirmed and by these presents doth give and grant, bargain, sell, allot
and release and confirm to the said Jacob Banell his heirs and assigns forever One certain
Tract or parcel of Land Situate by me and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and
Parish of Saint Luke's Containing by a late Survey two hundred acres to the same more or
less being Lot # 2 in the division of the Land of Edwin Boykin dec^d as will appear by the
common report of said Survey and bounded as follows to wit Beginning in the
run of the Swamp at a corner for the land of Deacon Ferguson dec^d also in corner lot # 101
thence down the run of said Swamp to the East side of the Causeway thence along the
line of Lot # 3 drawn by Henry Dennis S 19 E 10 poles to a post thence S 73 W 10 poles to a
post thence S 33 E 13 poles to a Turkey Oak a corner lot # 4 drawn by Edwin Boykin
thence along his line S 87 F 0 E 23 38 poles to the Centre of three Chestnut Trees standing in the run of
the little Swamp on Richard Williamson's dec^d line, thence up the run of said little swamp to the
first mentioned Swamp thence down the run of said Swamp to the beginning with all
and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in any
wise appertaining together with all the estate right title and interest of the said James
Boykin in and to the said granted or intended to be hereby granted tract or parcel of land
and premises One negro man Jacob One sorrel horse and one black mare To have and to
hold the said hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted tract or parcel of land
premises with its appurtenances also negro man Jacob One sorrel horse and one black
mare unto the said Jacob Banell his heirs Executors administrators and assigns
forever and the said James Boykin for himself his heirs Executors and administrators
soberly comaind promised and agrees to and with the said Jacob Banell his heirs
Executors administrators and assigns forever in manner and form following that is to say
that the said James Boykin his heirs Executors and Administrators shall for ever tract
or parcel of Land and premises with its appurtenances and negro man Jacob One bay
horse and One black mare hereby conveys unto the said Jacob Banell his heirs
Administrators and assigns against all persons whatsoever Shall and will warrant
and forever defend by these presents Upon Trust nevertheless that the said
Jacob Banell his heirs Executors and administrators Shall permit the said James
Boykin to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said tract or parcel of
land and premises with its appurtenances and the personal property undertaken
the profits thereof to his own use until default be made in the payment of the
aforesaid sum due either in the whole or in part and upon this further Trust that
