To have and to hold the said property unto the said Joseph Slade his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only purpose use and benefit of him the said Joseph Slade his heirs and assigns forever and the said John P. Slade after himself his heirs Executors &c the aforesaid property unto the said Joseph Slade his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever shall and will come and go as may be defined by these presents against the claim or claims of all persons whatsoever.
