 and William Pope, Eliza Pope, John Pope, Benjamin Ann and Francis Nelson
 Pope Children of Elizabeth Pope dec^d of the second part Witnesses that the said Elizabeth
 Pope for and in Consideration of the natural love and affection which she bears to her dear
 Children and Grand Children as well as for the further Consideration of one dollar to her
 in hand paid by the said grantees at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
 the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and conveyed
 to her aforesaid Children and Grand Children all the right title and interest which she
 holds in and to a certain Negro Slave of the name of Anthony which was appraised
 her as one of the dower Negroes out of the estate of her deceased husband John Pope who
 died among the said Children and Grand Children agreeable to the last will of John Pope
 dec^d as it is well to be done if Lewis dec^d or according to the laws of Distribution and she has
 Elizabeth for herself her heirs Executors and against the claim of her or all and any persons
 claiming by or through her do hereby warrant and defend unto the said Children and
 Grand Children their heirs &c. the right and Title of the aforesaid Negro Anthony in
 Witness whereof She hath this day and date first written Signed Sealed and acknowledged
 this Indenture.

 Eight hundred and thirty two between Thomas Summers of the first part and Edward
 Edwards of the second part and Peter J. Purse of the third part all of the County of
 Southampton and State of Virginia: Whereas the said Thomas Summers is party
 and itted unto the said Peter J. Purse in the sum of two hundred and thirty eight
 dollars fifty two cents as well appears by a Note for that sum bearing date the 2nd
 day of September 1832 and payable on Demand and whereas the said Peter J.
 first part as aforesaid to secure and hath agreed to secure the payment of the said debt
 in trust, with all charges attending the same or incurred by reason of the premises and by
 carrying the first part herein after mentioned unto the party of the second part, in trust to
 be sold for that purpose and on this 25th day of September 1832 the said
 Thomas Summers in Consideration of the premises and of the sum of one dollar
