This Indenture made and entered into this 12th day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty two between Eli Joryner and Charles his wife of the one part and Eliyah Joryner of the other part witnesses that the said Eli Joryner and Charles his wife for and in consideration of one thousand dollars current money of the Commonwealth to him in hand paid or deemed to be paid by him the said Eliyah Joryner at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents. With bargain and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the said Eliyah Joryner his heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land containing by estimation one hundred and sixty seven acres more or less being the tract of which the said Charles Lewis did Suzerain possess and covering the several parts purchased of Phadach Lewis and Henry Cherry. Thomas Brock and Eliyah his wife and James Settle as Trustee for the benefit of Ann Pellow all of which are fully appear by referring to the respective deeds and named by the head listing to form the lands belonging to Balz, Drake, Matthew Drake, Nathaniel Brewster, Matthew Joryner and other parts belonging to Matthew Drake and James Settle together with the reversions and reversions remainders and remainders together with all other parts and profits and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular the premises hereon before mentioned and intended to be bargained and sold with every part and parcel thereof unto the said Eliyah Joryner his heirs and assigns the said tract of land unto the said Eli Joryner and Matthew his wife their heirs and assigns and any person claiming under them shall and lawfully warrant and forever defend by these presents Witnessed whereof the said Eli Joryner and Charles his wife
