Benjamin E Blunt of the other part all of the County of Southampton and shaleshire is Witnessed that the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife then living and in consequence of the promises and the further consecration of the land of the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife by the said Benjamin E Blunt, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have given granted bargained and sold and confirmed and by these presents do give grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Benjamin E Blunt his heirs and assigns One certain parcel of Land including the family grave yards on the Plantation lately sold by the said Benjamin E Blunt and his wife Sarah to the said John Whitehead as well appearing hereunto in the Clerk's Office of Southampton Containing by estimation One acre be the same more or less and bounded on all sides by the said Lands of John Whitehead beginning at a Sycamore tree at the foot of the Hill near the said Grave Yard thence nearly a North (more or less) to a point where East several Apple trees the side line to a Sycamore thence thence to a persimmon and thence west to the Sycamore at the beginning of the said road the aforesaid Parcel of Land to the only proper use of him the said Benjamin E Blunt and his heirs forever with the privilege of having free access to the said acre of Land through the said Whitehead's enclosures at all times, and the said Benjamin E Blunt by these presents agrees that he will never occupy the aforesaid Parcel of Land for any other purpose than a Grave Yard and that the said John Whitehead and wife Mary do on their part warrant and forever defend the right and title of the said acre of Land with the privilege herein before inserted unto him the said Benjamin E Blunt and his heirs forever against the claim of him the said John Whitehead and Mary his wife and against the claim of them or either of them their heirs and against the claim of all and every other person or persons who shall or will claim the said land and the said day and year first above written Signed sealed and acknowledged before us.
