Whitcherupf This Indenture made and entered into this 10th day of October in the year of
our Lord 1832, Between John Whitcherupf and Mary his wife of the one part and
Benjamin E Blunt of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia
as witnesseth that the said John Whitcherupf and Mary his wife their day for and in
consideration of the premises and the further consideration of the sum of One hundred and
thirteen pounds paid by the said Benjamin E Blunt the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
have given granted bargained and sold and confirmed and by these presents do
give grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Benjamin E Blunt his heirs
of C. One certain parcel of Land including the family grave yard on the Plantation
lately sold by the said Benjamin E Blunt and his wife Sarah to the said John
Whitcherupf as well appear by the same record in the Clerks Office of Southampton
Containing by estimation One acre to the same more or less and bounded on the west
by the said Lands of John Whitcherupf beginning at a big camber tree at the foot
of the Hill near the said Grave Yard thence nearly a North course to a post tree
East several Apple trees the said line to a big camber stone stands to
a persimmon, and thence West to the big camber at the beginning to have unto
her, the aforesaid Parcel of Land to the only propriety of him the said Benjamin
E Blunt and his heirs forever with the privilege of having free access thereto
out of Land through the said Whitcherupf enclosures at all times, and he the said
Benjamin Blunt agrees part agrees that he will never occupy the aforesaid
of Land for any other purpose than a Grave Yard and they the said John Whitcherupf
and wife Mary do on their part warrant and forever defend the right and title
of said acre of Land and with the privilege herein before inserted unto him the said
Benjamin E Blunt and his heirs forever against the claim of him the said John
Whitcherupf and Mary his wife and against the claim of them or either of them
and against the claim of all and every other person or persons what so ever as
witness of our hands and seals the day and year first above written
