 bargained Sold alured enfeoffed & decaud and Conformed by these presents doth give grant
 buy and sell all my enfeoffments and Conformities to the said William C. Parker his heirs
 & assigns and all my right title and interest in a tract of land lying and being in the County of
 Suffolk containing 565 acres to the same more or less of which a certain John Penn
 did possess and which is now held by Elizabeth Porter who before intermarrying with
 the said Porter was the widow of the said John Penn also the following slaves
 a Negro quo by the name of Lucrecia and negro man Jerry and balaunt that may be
 due the said Alexander P. Puto up at Settlement of his transactions as administrator
 with the will of Edward Russ deceased merchant and entrepreneur the appur-
 tenances to the said tract or part of Land belonging or any way appertaining and
 the future increase of the said female Slave Lucrecia and all the estate right title
 and interest of the said Alexander P. Puto in and to the said tract of Land and
 premises So have and to hold the said hereby granted part of Land and
 premises with its appurtenances together with the aforesaid slaves and the future
 increase of the female and all the other property debts or money hereby Conveyed into
 the said William C. Parker his heirs Executors administrators and assigns foreward
 upon Trust Marshall that the said William C. Parker shall permit the said
 Alexander P. Puto to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said tract and
 part of Land and premises together unto the aforesaid slaves and take the profits
 thereof to his own use until the said William C. Parker shall be called upon by the
 persons hereby intended to be summed to make a Sale thereof or any part thereof and thereafter
 this further Trust that his heirs Executors administrators or assigns shall and will
 upon the request of the parties hereto whose debts are intended to be secured by the
 said property or such part thereof as may be necessary for the purpose after giving
 twenty days Notice by advertisement to be set up at the door of the Sheriff of Suffolk
 County and the County of Southampton County at public auction for sale, the money
 to the highest bidder and out of the monies arising from the sale of the said Land
 and out of such as may be found due to the said Alexander P. Puto as aforesaid
 with the like amount of the two Edward Russ deceased executors Settlement of his
 transactions therein shall after satisfying the Chars or thereof and all other expenses
 attending the execution of this Trust first pay to the two Bailey Bry and and their
 his wife the sum amounting to £ with interest demandly the sum
 Samuel Blunt amounting to £ with interest and finally the sum
 due Bailey Bryant and Charles his wife amounting to £ with interest
 so much thereof as the sum may be sufficient to discharge out of the monies
 arising from the sale of the negro girl & friends after deducting the expenses
 of carrying this Trust into execution pay off and discharge the Bonds to Sampson
