Mason of the second part of the County of Southampton: Whereas the said Harry Harris and Alexander P. Peto of the said County entered into an agreement in pursuance of which for exchange of Land whereby the said Alexander P. Peto was to convey to the said Harry Harris the tract of Land and appurtenances by him bought of James McPacker Esquire of said County and bounded as in the said Packer's Decd of Record in the County Court which was to be conveyed by the said Peto to the said Harry Harris and to convey to him another parcel of Land hereinafter described and to cause the same to be conveyed to him and the said John C.
