This Indenture made this third day of October 1832 Between Nicholas M. Schrell
of the one part and Peter Simmons of Seaford part last party of the County of Sussex in
Wetnepsell that the said Nicholas M. Schrell for and in consideration of the sum of two
hundred and thirty five dollars to him now paid by the said Peter Simmons it is agreed
the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the
said Nicholas M. Schrell hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents given
bargained and sold unto the said Peter Simmons his heirs and assigns a tract or parcel of
land adjoining Seaford containing two and a half acres more or less as bounded and
follows to wit Beginning at a post on the road about two hundred and forty eight
yards from the corner of Green & 1st Street back a straight line about North East one
hundred and five yards to a post thrown a straight line about North East to a fence post
this line on the path leading from the main road to the old race field. To have and
to hold the said two and a half acres of land more or less unto the said Peter Simmons
his heirs and assigns forever to and for the only purpose and intent of the said Peter
Simmons his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Nicholas M. Schrell doth witness and
agree to and with the said Peter Simmons that he will warrant and forever defend
the right and title of the aforesaid land unto the said Peter Simmons his heirs and
assigns forever against the claim or claims of all persons whomsoever. In witness whereof

James Clayton of the one part and Willis Eley of the other part. Wetnepsell that the said
James Clayton in consideration of the sum of One hundred of lawful money of this Commonwealth
in hand paid by the said Willis Eley at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Have bargained and sold and doth hereby bind
bargain and sell unto the said Willis Eley his heirs and assigns a certain tract of land lying
and being on Black Water River formerly Jenkins's plantation and being the land bounded
of Giblows Eley containing by estimation five hundred and Sixty acre together with all and
singular houses thereon and buildings of any kind and lands thereon to mutual
pastures feeding common woods and meadows. Mary Waters Water Conserv. for the time past
granted easements common advantages and benefits heretofore and appertaining to
what power to the said land belonging or appertaining or with the same used and enjoyed
or excepted taken or known as part parcel or member thereof or belonging to
the same or any part thereof and the revision and review is demanded and remained
yearly and other rents apes and profits thereon and of every part and parcel thereof to
have and to hold the said land with the community hereditaments and all and singular
other the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and
