 Knows Whereas that the said John Clayton and Pamela his wife in consideration of the sum of Eighty Nine dollars and Seventy five Cents of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them
 her husband paid by the said Henry Lewis at or before the sealing and delivery of these
 presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. Know say and do all and by
 me two of these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Henry Lewis his heirs and assigns
 by law a certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Smithfield on Parke's Branch
 containing the lands of Willard Williams and Henry Lewis formerly part of the Adams tract
 and being the land I purchased of Doctor Edward M Taylor containing by estimation forty
 seven acres be the same more or less together with all and singular houses dove houses
 barns, buildings yards gardens orchards land tenements meadows pastures, fadings common
 woods underwood, ways waters, water course fishing privileges, profits communitie adjoin-
 ing ements her dements and appurtenances what ever to the said land belonging
