Worrell of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Whereas
the said Laves Brown is justly indebted to the said ~~Thomas Worrell~~ by note bearing
date with this Indenture for the sum of Twenty Dollars which debt with legal interest
then accruing the said Laves Brown is willing and desirous to secure it with the
personal estate that he and in consideration of the sum of one dollar lawful money of Virginia
to the said Laves Brown in hand paid by the said James D. Bryant Treasurer and before the
making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said
Laves Brown he doth give granted bargain sell alien and convey release and confirm
and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien and convey release and confirm to the
said James D. Bryant his heirs and assigns forever the following property to wit Three
feather Beds and furniture One spinning wheel One pair of Cotton Cards two pine chest
one iron Table one iron tray and two One iron pot and books one spindle one ax and
two wooden heads To have and to hold the above hereby granted property unto the
said James D. Bryant his heirs and assigns forever and he the said Laves Brown for
himself his heirs and assigns doth hereby covenants promises and agrees to and with the
said James D. Bryant his heirs and assigns forever that he will by these
presents van and for word of end the right and title of the aforesaid property against
the claims or demands of all and every person or persons who so ever before this date
had of that the said James D. Bryant his heirs and assigns shall permit the said
Laves Brown to remain quiet and peaceable possession until the sum to be made
in the payment of the said sum of Twenty Dollars either in the whole or in
part and then upon this further Trust at any time thereafter when he shall be
thereto requested by the said Thomas Worrell his heirs and assigns sell all
