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This Indenture made this 14th day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty two between Henry Beal of the County of Southampton of the one part and Henry Ellis and James C. Little trustees of the County of Sussex of the other part Witness their firm consideration of the Sum of twenty Six dollars and Six cents due by notes and accounts now and all other accounts that may be lawfully be made by him the said Henry Ellis and sold and by these presents the said Henry Ellis and sold unto the said Henry Ellis all my household and kitchen furniture plantation utensils &c. and a bed or beds my Ox of red cotton fodder, Corn and one calf one steer and all and every thing that I possess do possess and behoof of him the said Henry Ellis his heirs and assigns forever But the true intent and meaning of this indenture is that the said Henry Ellis stands indebted to the said Henry Ellis the Sum of twenty Six dollars and Six Cts. four cent money of Virginia to be paid on or before the 16 day of the present month and the said Henry Beal is selling the said Sum of money should be paid to the said Henry Ellis his heirs &c. now if the said Henry Beal has this Execution &c. do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Henry Ellis his heirs &c. the above Sum of twenty Six dollars and Six cents on or before the twentieth day of the present month. ensuring together with all contingent charges attending the same the above indenture to be sold and of no effect But if the above named Sum of twenty Six dollars and Six cents and the contingent charges attending the same shall not be paid on or before the twentieth day of the present month then the above named James C. Little may enter upon and possess the above mentioned property and make sale thereof at public auction for ready money by giving ten days notice and pay the said Henry Ellis the Sum above mentioned with lawful interest
