Whereas Robert Cook late of Sunny County, died seized and possessed of a certain tract or parcel
of Land lying in the County of Southampton, called and known by the name of Cook's Plantation
and whereas the said Robert Cook did intestate leaving an only child Maria R. Cook daughter
of his whole Estate, and whereas the said Maria intermarried with Parke Lewis Shultz
and did under lawful age and without issue whereby the said tract of Land descended to
her heirs on the part of her said Father and whereas a Anna Maria Woodford widow
of William Woodford dec'd of the County of Fayette in the State of Kentucky is entitled
as one of the Children of her mother, who was sister of the said Robert Cook, to an
undivided interest in the said tract of Land to her one third of one fourth part thereof
and whereas by her power of Attorney duly executed and dated on the 15th day of October
in this present year she the said Anna Maria hath duly authorized and empowered
John S. Mason of the County of Southampton to sell her said undivided interest & convey
the money and make conveyance for the same: Now Her said petitioners made and taken
into this 19th day of November 1832. Between the said John S. Mason Attorney as aforesaid
of the first part and John Boykin of the second part it is agreed that for and in con-
sideration of the sum of one hundred and Eighty Six dollars and Six Cents to him
for hand paid by the said John Boykin at or before the signing and delivery of these
present the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said John S. Mason
Attorney as aforesaid hath bargained sold and delivered and by these presents doth
grant sell and convey unto the said John Boykin all the right title and interest in
the said tract of Land which descended to her, within our right as one of her said
mother's Children To have and to hold the said right and title herein contained
to be conveyed and no more than the said Anna Maria Woodford of or unto
the said undivided one third of one fourth of the said tract of Land unto him the
said John Boykin his heirs and assigns forever. And the said John S. Mason
Attorney as aforesaid, and not for him or of the said right interest and title in the
said undivided portion of the said Land, were warrant and defend to the said John
Boykin, and has been against the claim of her the said Anna Maria Woodford
and all others claiming through or under her. In testimony whereof the said John S.
Mason as Attorney as aforesaid has hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day
and year above written
