Pike and Mary Eliza his wife and their heirs and assigns and against all persons whomsoever shall and will by these presents be so bound warrant and defend. Mason of the second part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Williamson for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and sixteen dollars paid to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said John C. Mason a certain tract of Land situate lying and being in the County aforesaid and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a pine tree at a corner to John C. Mason thence along his line S. 87. 11. 67 poles to a red oak at 147 p. N. 76. 2 poles S. 14. 10. 2 poles at 81. 6. 32 poles at 175. 6. 12 poles at S. 53. 12. E. 12 poles S. 5. 5. 14 poles S. 50. 8. 0 poles S. 5. 8. 10 poles S. 2. E. 14 poles along John Shepherd's line to a black gum a corner to Benjamin Williamson thence a new chopped line adjoining the said Williamson at 47. 6. 32 poles and at 6. 1/2 E. 88 poles to the beginning according to a plat of survey recently made by William Samir and containing thirty five four acres the same more or less.
