do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Harry Harris his heirs and assigns
that they the said Alexander P. Park and Mary Eliza his wife the said tract of
land with its appurtenances unto him the said Harry Harris his heirs and assigns
against them the said Alexander P. Park and Mary Eliza his wife and their heirs
and assigns and against all persons whom ever shall and will by these presents sue for or enter upon
