Exam of Debts
& Jps Diary
May 15/1830.

This Indenture made and entered into this 16th day of November one thousand Eight
hundred and thirty two betweenathan Berry of the first part. Egerton Sonnington and
part and Benjamin Rochester of the third part all of the County of Southampton being of age
of discretion that whereas the said Nathan Berry stands greatly indebted to the said
Egerton Sonner in the sum of Seventy five dollars by note bearing the same date with
this present writing And the said Nathan Berry being willing and desirous to
Secure the payment of the said sum of money to the said Egerton Sonner. doth
well for and in Consideration of the promises as for and in Consideration of the sum
of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Egerton Sonner at or before the making
and delivery of these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the
said Egerton Sonner the following property to wit One Cart and wheels and
one bow and ten sheats, one plough, two plough heads, and Cultivator, three wooden kegs
one hair now wedged, two axes, one pair flat irons, one pot, one pan, two shells
one Spider, one pack, and hooks, one bush hook, two feather bedded beds and
furniture, four sitting chairs, one spinning wheel and Cards, one tel, one pair
three trays one pine table, one desk, one dozen plates, one set cups and saucers
one pair knives and forks, one Coffe and one tea pot, sugar dish and milk pot,
one set table Spoons, one set tea Spoons, three bowls, nine black bottles, two tickles,
one decantier, three pitchers one demijohn, two jugs, one hand scarf, one pair
knives one shot gun, one set blacksmith's tools last count of one strong box and
grubbing hoe, one tea trunk. Crop of Corn gathered up to and one thousand eight hundred and thirty
with all its premises and appurtenances and every part thereof with the said
Egerton Sonner his heirs and assigns forever. Notwithstand upon the condition that
should the said Nathan Berry fail or cease to be paid unto the said Egerton Sonner his
heirs or assigns on or before the 04th day of December One thousand Eight hundred and thirty
then the aforesaid sum of money with interest and all costs then the aforesaid
agreement to be void and of no effect. But should the said Nathan Berry fail to pay
unto the said Egerton Sonner the aforesaid sum of money with interest and costs which
thrusts required then and in that case it shall be lawful for the aforesaid Benjamin
Rochester who is mutually chosen as Trustee to proceed to sell after giving due
notice by advertisement the aforesaid property or so much thereof as may be sufficient
to pay the aforesaid sum of money with interest and all costs then incurred unto
the said Egerton Sonner and the balance if any to the said Nathan Berry for
lawfully discharging the said Nathan Berry from this obligation. In testimony
