This Indenture made this 11<sup>th</sup> day of December 1832. Between James Edward of the first part, John R. Williams of the second part, and Richard Porter of the third part, Whereas the said James Edward is greatly indebted to the said Richard Porter in the sum of Three hundred and thirteen dollars and 58 Cents, due by Note bearing date Nov. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1830. Now this Indenture Witnesseth, that for the and in Consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said James Edward, which said sum by the said John R. Williams at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, he receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Edward, having even granted, bargained, sold and confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell &c. to the said John R. Williams his heirs and assigns forever, all my Crop of Corn, fodder Cotton Seed, Stock of fall Hinds, Plantation, tenements, household and Kitchen furniture with every other species of property in any wise appertaining or belonging to him the said James Edward; To have and to hold, the aforesaid property hereby conveyed unto the said John R. Williams his heirs and assigns forever, to the only proper use and behoof of him the said John R. Williams his heirs and assigns forever, upon Trust nevertheless that the said John R. Williams shall permit the said James Edward to remain in quiet possession of the aforesaid property, and take the profits thereof to his own proper use and behoof of him the said James Edward, until default be made in the payment of the said sum of Three hundred and thirteen dollars and 58 Cents, either in part or in the whole and then upon the said Trust that him the said John R. Williams or his heirs or assigns shall and will so soon after the happening of such default of payment, as he may think proper, or the said Richard Porter or his heirs or assigns shall request, sell the aforesaid property or such part thereof as shall be sufficient for the purpose of paying the aforesaid debt, with interest and Cost, and him the said Richard Porter may on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the month wherein the said property is so sold, and out of the proceeds of such sale satisfy the above debt with interest and Cost. And him the said Richard Porter doth hereby bind himself his heirs &c. to take the aforesaid property on a Credit of some month, the said after satisfying shall still interest and Cost pay to him the said James Edward his heirs &c. But if the whole of the above debt shall be paid off, and is charged to the sales factum of him the said Richard Porter, on or before the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the instant, when the same is paid to what no default of payment of the said sum of Three hundred and thirteen dollars and 58<sup>c</sup> is made then this Indenture to be void and to remain in full force and virtue.
