nance before mentioned unto the said Richard Clegg his heirs and assigns forever. And
the said Robert G. Sommons and Elizabeth his wife for themselves and their heirs the
said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned
unto the said Richard Clegg his heirs and assigns forever from the day or days of whom
the said Robert G. Sommons and Elizabeth his wife or either of them shall or either of
them and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall will and do even unto
and forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Robert G. Sommons

I now afform by these presents that S. J. Parker, of the County of Southampton on the 2d of Decem-
ber, 1832, have manumitted emancipated and set free and by these presents do manumit, commence to set free and
set free a negro man named Mount (sometimes called Cornish Black) an I do hereby declare
the said Mount to be entirely liberated from Slavery, and is entitled to all the rights and privileges of
a free person who is in my power to set him free. The said Mount is about 30 years of age of bright complexion
and appears of the right age. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal
this the 17th day of December 1832.
