For all and every these presents that Joseph Parker of the County of Southampton on the sale of cer-
tain slaves manumitted emancipated and set free and by these presents do manumit emancipate and
set free a negro man slave named Daniel (some times called Daniel Parker) and he hereby declared
the said Daniel to be entirely liberated from slavery, and is entitled to all the rights and privileges of
a free person which it is my power to do him to the said Daniel is about years of age of legal age and
undisturbed of the right to. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this 17th day of December 1832
