Nicholas the wife of William Nicholas formerly to a certain Deed bearing date on the 15 day of December 1832 and her estate annexed personally appeared before us in our County aforesaid and being examined by us in private and apart from her husband and having the Deed aforesaid fully explained to her. She the said Melisa F. Nicholas acknowledged the same to be her act and deed and declares that she had willingly signed sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it. Know all men by these presents that Ed. Thomas B. Pleas of the County of Southampton Texas to a certain Deed of Conveyance from Jacob Turner to Phineas M. Easley both of the County of Southampton bearing date the 29th day of June one thousand Eight hundred and thirty for certain purposes therein named as well more fully appears by reference to said Deed of the one part & John Bryghin of the same County of the other part. Wherefore that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by the said John Bryghin at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Bryghin and conveyed to the said John Bryghin his heirs and assigns all the right title claim and interest of the said Jacob Turner's land whereon his son and daughter Turner now resides lying in the County of Southampton which said land was conveyed in the aforesaid deed in trust which is as aforesaid and sold as the law directs and was purchased by the said John Bryghin for the aforesaid sum of one hundred dollars to have and to hold the same unto the said John Bryghin his heirs and assigns to him and that use and behoof forever and the said Thomas B. Pleas Justice aforesaid do covenant with the said John Bryghin his heirs and assigns to account and defend the same to the said John Bryghin as Justice aforesaid against the lawful claims and demands of the said Jacob Turner or any person or persons claiming under him.
