She the said Melissa Fickelson acknowledged the same to be her act and deed and declares that she had willingly signed sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it. Know all men by these presents that Ed Thomas B. Pleas of the County of Southampton Va to a certain Deed of Conveyance from Jacob Turner to Phineas M. & Ailey both of the County of Southampton bearing date the 29th day of June one thousand Eight hundred and thirty for certain purposes therein named as well more fully appears by reference to said Deed of the one part & John Bryson of the same County of the other part. Witness that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me in hand paid by the said John Bryson at or before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by me with my hand and convey to the said John Bryson his heirs and assigns all the right title claim and interest of the said Jacob Turner's land whereon his one last Wills Testament now resides lying in the County of Southampton which said land was conveyed in the aforesaid deed in trust which is as is contained and held as the law directs and was purchased by the said John Bryson for the aforesaid sum of one hundred dollars to have and to hold the same unto the said John Bryson his heirs and assigns to him and that are our heirs of forever and the said Thomas B. Pleas do covenant with the said John Bryson his heirs and assigns to warrant and defend the same to the said John Bryson as he shall see against the lawful claims and demands of the said Jacob Turner or any person or persons claiming under him.
