

Turner His Indenture made this 15th day of December on the year of our Lord Christ 1832
 To William Copeland Turner of the one part and Joel Cornish of the other part, all of the County
 of Southampton Parish of Stokenay and State of New Jersey: Whereof it is declared that the said
 Copeland and Turner for and in Consideration of the sum of Ten thousand dollars of lawful money
 of this Commonwealth to him or him heirs by the said Joel Cornish at or before the making
 and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have
 bargained and sold, and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Joel Cornish
 his heirs and assigns One Certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation
 seventy six acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows: beginning at a stake
 given at Ballan's mill pond thence a line of marked to a degree or in straight line
 thence a line of marked trees to a Turkey oak in G. D. Antford's line thence a line of
 marked trees to Black Creek thence up said Creek and Mill Pond to the beginning
 together with all and singular the houses, outbuildings, edifices, buildings, yards, gardens,
 orchards, lands and tenements, woods, swamps, water and water courses, rights, claims, in-
 terests, easements, servitudes, and appurtenances, what ever to the said land belonging in
 any wise appertaining to the same or any part thereof, and the revenues and accruing
 and every part and parcel thereof To have and to hold the said 76 acres of Land unto the
 the person or persons hereinafter mentioned or intended to be sold, with all his right and title
 unto the said Joel Cornish his heirs and assigns forever, he and for the only proper use and
 behoof of him the said Joel Cornish his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Copeland Turner
 for himself his heirs the said land with all and singular the appurtenances before
 mentioned unto the said Joel Cornish his heirs and assigns free from the claim, demand
 of him the said Copeland Turner his heirs Executors administrators and from all and
 every other person or persons who are or shall and will warrant and forever defend

 confirm unto my said daughter Mary Edwards the following property, to wit: one father bed and furniture
 on spinning wheel, 1 spit, 1 spindle, 1 sitting chair, 1 chest, one table, 1 desk, 1 bed, 1 dresser, 1 table, 1
 and to hold the property aforesaid to the only proper use and behoof of the said Mary Edwards and her heirs
 & assigns forever. And I the said Benjamin Edwards do hereby warrant and defend the title to the said property
 to her the said Mary Edwards her heirs and assigns against the claim of myself and all other persons
