Witnesseth that the said John Dnegro for and in Consideration of the sum of four dollars to him now hand paid by the said Nathaniel Rockelle at or before the making & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both parties bargain and sold and conveyed unto the said Rockelle all the right and title in and to the following property to wit One Certain Tract of Land lying in the County of Southampton and adjoining the lands of Brecken Bryant and Henry Goodrich and others and being the land which Rice B. Pinck purchased of Thomas Edwings and others and by him conveyed by Deed to the said Rockelle called and known by the name of the Marston containing by Survey two hundred and Eighty Eight acres more or less the following Slaves Gt. negro man Frederick, negro man Jack and one named John R. H. have and to hold the said granted land and Slaves to have the said Rockelle his heirs and assigns against the claim or claims of him the said John Dnegro or all and every person or persons claiming by or through him.
