J. J. Andenture made this 31<sup>st</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand Eight hundred and thirty three between Jonathan Bankford and Elizabeth his wife of the one part & James George of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Heth<sup>el</sup> that the said Jonathan Bankford and Elizabeth his wife for an Consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars gold and lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said James George the receipt whereof the said Jonathan Bankford and Elizabeth his wife doth acknowledge themselves to be fully satisfied and paid hath granted bargained and sold alured enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James George to have and to his heirs forever One certain habot tract of land and premises situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and Parish of Elboway being all the land that the said Jonathan Bankford purchased of Charles George by Deed Containing by estimation one hundred and fifteen acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a maple standing on the Branch called the meadow Branch on the side of the road leading from Black Water Bridge to Elboway thence along said branch to a place where the branch and person come together from thence down the ridge going of Rogers Branch
