

discharge all necessary and usual costs and expenses attending the said sale and the conveyance, then pay and discharge the debts aforesaid and interest thereon due the said Edward and the debt and interest aforesaid for which the said Edward is the personal representative And it is agreed between the parties hereto that the said Rochelle shall retain the possession of the property aforesaid and take the profits thereof so long as he has no other purposes herein before expressed And the said Rochelle hereby covenants with the said Edwards that he will well and truly deliver up the property aforesaid to be sold according to the true intent and meaning of these presents and the said Edwards hereby covenants and agrees with the other parties hereto that he will well and truly execute the true hereby Confided to him and that if the said Rochelle shall discharge the debts before mentioned due the said Edward and the debt for which the said Edward is the security with all interest due thereon as well as the cost of attending thereto that he will release and re-convey to the said Rochelle the title hereby given to him in and to the property aforesaid. This Indenture made this 31st day of August in the year of our Lord Christ on Twain Eight hundred and thirty Between Jonathan Lankford and Elizabeth his wife of the one part & James Forner of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that the said Jonathan Lankford and Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars good and lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said James Forner the receipt whereof the said Jonathan Lankford and Elizabeth his wife do hereby acknowledge themselves a party salesmen and paid hath granted bargain and sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James Forner to him and to his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid and Parish of St. Mary being all the tract of land that the said Jonathan Lankford purchased of Charles Forner by Will containing by estimation one hundred and fifty acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a maple standing in the branch called the meadow branch on the side of the road leading from Black Water Bridge to all enow thence along said branch to a pine where the branch and pecon comes together from thence down the north spring of Rogers Run and
