This Indenture made this 12th day of February in the year of our Lord 1833 Between Pope of the first part Stephen Edmunds of the second part and Elizabeth Secors of the third part: Whereas the said Pope is jointly indebted to the said Elizabeth Secors in the sum of sixteen dollars and forty two and one half Cents as by a Bond bearing date on the 12th day of February 1833 more fully appears which said Debt with the interest and accruing cost the said Pope is willing and desirous to secure. And this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in Consideration of the premises and also for the further Consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Oregon to the said Pope in hand paid by the said Stephen Edmunds at and before the foregoing delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Pope the said given granted bargained and sold released and confirmed and by these presents full given grant bargained and confirmed to the said Stephen Edmunds his heirs and assigns forever One lay mare and her future increase One bull and whole yearling of cattle and three increase six head of hogs and three increase four head of sheep and three increase three feather beds and furniture and two prime cows. To have and to hold the foregoing granted property together with the increase of the said stock unto the said Stephen Edmunds his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever and the said Pope for himself his heirs Executors and administrators do hereby Covenant promise and agree to and with the said Stephen Edmunds his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever that is to say that the said Pope his heirs Executors and administrators shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents upon their merits that the said Stephen Edmunds his heirs Executors and administrators shall permit the said Pope to remain in quiet and peaceable possession of the said property until default be made in the payment of the said sum of sixteen dollars and forty two and one half Cents or in part. And then upon this further time that they Elizabeth Secors and Pope any one of them do soon after the happening of such default of payment may proceed to give the Justice notice to suit after giving twenty days notice of date and place of date and out of the proceeds of such sale pay to Elizabeth Secors or her legal representative the aforesaid sum of sixteen dollars and forty two and one half Cents and all cost which may necessarily accrue and the balance of any pay over to Pope or such other person as may be legally qualified to receive the same given under our hands and seals this 12th day of February 1833.
